





SEASCAPE CERT- NEIGHBOR BULLETIN #3 WHAT TO DO ON THE DAY OF A DISASTER

- 1. On the Day of a Disaster in Seascape, check your house and people.
- 2. Fill out your Seascape CERT House Disaster Survey and tack the top half onto your front door.
- 3. Go to Seascape Park, register with CERT, and submit the bottom half of your Seascape CERT Disaster House Survey to CERT.

These are the questions you will answer on your Seascape CERT House Disaster Survey.

• Is anyone in the house injured?

If YES, bring the person to Seascape Park to the triage area and tell a CERT team member about the injury. If you can't bring the person, go to Seascape Park and tell a CERT member about the injury.

• Is there a fire in your house?

If YES and it is small (like a campfire), put it out with your fire extinguisher. If YES and it is a large fire, evacuate the house, fight the fire after evacuation. Notify CERT people at Seascape Park about the fire.

• Do you smell gas in your house?

If YES, do not use matches, candles, electrical switches, plugs, flashlights or other spark producers.

Go outside and turn off the gas at the meter, turn off the electricity from outside, only if you smell gas.

If NO, do not turn off the gas at the meter. Go to Seascape Park and tell a CERT person about gas.

Is there water leaking anywhere in your house?

If YES, fill your tubs and sinks and then shut off the water at the main.

Is everything OK and you will be staying in your home?

If YES, tack your Seascape CERT Disaster House Survey onto your front door. Go to Seascape Park –register with CERT and submit the copy of your Seascape CERT House Disaster Survey to CERT.

Is everything OK and you will be leaving your home?

Tack your Seascape CERT House Disaster Survey onto your front door and turn off the electricity at the meter before you leave.
